Dear Ms. TEST,

Because Emma was in the Newborn Intensive Care Unit at Green Acres Children's Hospital, she is eligible for follow up at the NBICU Follow-Up/Infant-Toddler Clinic. The purpose of this clinic is to give you information about her development.

The clinic specialists will check your child for growth, hearing, mental, motor, and social development. More specifically, we will look at the way she reaches for objects, plays with toys, interacts with people and moves about the environment. It is also a time to have your questions answered regarding the hospitalization. We will be working with your child's pediatrician, who will receive a report of each visit. We have enclosed a brochure that explains what we do.

Emma will be offered at least three visits to the clinic, scheduled around the ages of three to six months, one year and two years. Your insurance will be billed. If you are covered by an HMO, prior authorization will be necessary. Please bring all insurance cards, stickers or authorization papers with you to the clinic.

Clinics are held on Wednesday mornings, and appointments can be made by calling NBICU Follow-Up/Infant-Toddler Clinic at (415) 600-0000. We look forward to seeing you and your baby. All the exams are done in one morning session between 9 AM and Noon. Parents attend all the exams with their child and the clinic is set up informally, using a waiting room as a play area. We will make every effort to attend to any special needs you may have.

If you have any questions please feel free to call us at any time. A staff member will be calling you to arrange or confirm Emma's first appointment.
